RECIPE AND DIRECTIONS FOR SIZING CANVAS WITH RABBIT SKIN GLUE

Note: Keep in mind that glue strength can vary affecting the water to glue ratio.

INGREDIENTS

- dry hide glue
- cold tap water
- double boiler
- electric hotplate with rheostat for temperature regulation
- wooden spoon

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Place 1 part hide glue to 10 parts water in the top pan of the double boiler. By volume this would be .4 cup hide glue to 1 quart water. By weight this would be 2.4 oz hide glue to 1 quart water.
- 2. Soak the glue until it has absorbed the water and swollen (approximately 3 hours), stirring occasionally to keep glue from sticking together.
- 3. Put water in bottom pan of double boiler and heat over the hot plate until water boils, then transfer to the top pan.
- 4. Heat glue gently on hot plate (do not boil). You never want to boil the glue as it will lose its adhesiveness.
- 5. Remove double boiler from heat when the glue has completely melted.
- 6. Use glue while hot. If the glue cools it will become gelled, and be more likely to create a thick film.

RECIPE AND DIRECTIONS FOR SIZING PAPER WITH RABBIT SKIN GLUE

INGREDIENTS

Same as for sizing canvas.

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Same as for sizing canvas, except...
- 2. When glue size is fully prepared, dilute mixture with an additional 30 parts warm water (3 qt. By this formula).
- 3. Pour mixture into a wide tray or pan for dipping the paper.
